Interview with Dick Hayes, President of the Board

On December 11, 2019, Hayes Family Foundation Board President Richard "Dick" Hayes was chosen to be a speaker at Escuela de Guadalupe's One Child at a Time breakfast fundraising event. Dick shared his story about what drew him to Escuela de Guadalupe, where he has served on their board 6½ years. "When I was in the Peace Corps about a half a century ago, I left with two conclusions: most people can solve their own problems if they get their own tools and the long-term solution of getting out of poverty is a quality education." Escuela de Guadalupe is an affordable, faith-based dual language school. The annual tuition is \$2,500 per year, significantly less expensive than most private or Catholic school options where the annual tuition ranges between \$8,000-\$10,000 per year. Most families who attend Escuela de Guadalupe qualify for financial support and 50% qualify for free-and-reduced lunch. Escuela de Guadalupe makes quality education available to families who would otherwise not be able to attend private schools. As Dick shared, "all parents want a better life for their kids – it's a universal desire."

What keeps Dick at Escuela de Guadalupe? "Number one: it works. 98% of kids who attended Escuela de Guadalupe graduate from high school. Escuela de Guadalupe began as a K-5 school and has now expanded to 8th grade. Our first 8th grade class graduated from high school last summer with an average GPA of 3.3. Number two: it's magical. Two different cultures are in school together for ten years. They walk in another's shoes. The kids learn that people are just people. Think about the impact of that magic as we move into the future." Half of the Escuela students speak only English when starting Kindergarten and half speak only Spanish.

75% of Escuela de Guadalupe's financial support comes from community support and 25% from tuition. 240 people attended the December One Child at a Time event and approximately \$70,000 was raised. 
